NO TO STOCK-OUTS! Patients in control

Since 2009, several hundred cases solved annually:

- Identifying stock-outs and helping individual patients:
 - ✓ Almost 700 people received emergency supplies of ARVs or referral support during the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020
 - ✓ 383 people fleeing from the war in Ukraine received emergency supplies of ARVs in 2022
- Preventing delivery disruptions that can affect thousands of patients in a specific territory
 - ✓ Signalling systemic stock-outs of 3TC in 2019 and 2024 and DTG in 2023–2024 in Russia
- Pushing for sustainable solutions (e.g., increased budget, optimization of procurement portfolio) which have a nationwide impact



ARV procurement transparency



Community-based organizations monitoring procurement of anti-HIV, -HCV, and -TB drugs to help:

- Reduce drug prices
- Switch to optimal choices

Numerous significant price reduction cases due to direct civil society interventions, including, but not limited to:

- Price reduction for TDF/FTC and ritonavir in Moldova in 2021 leading to at least 70% economy
- Price reduction for DRV in Kyrgyzstan from \$USD 350/pack (original) to \$USD 70 (generic)

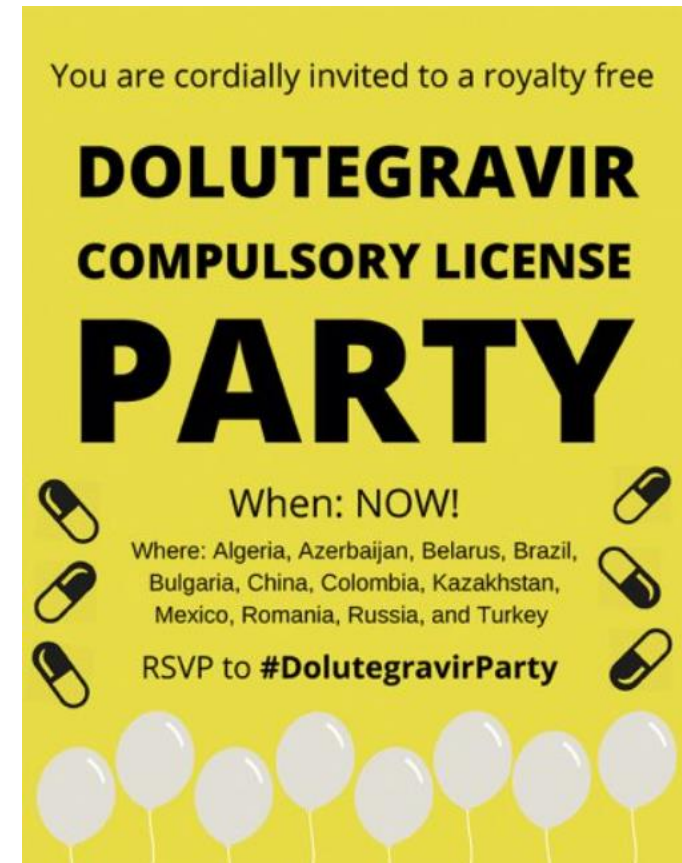
Switching to optimal choices, for example:

- Gradual shift from LPV/r to DTG for 2nd line in Armenia

Spotlight on access to dolutegravir

Numerous CLM interventions in EECA to monitor the patent status, licensing agreements, and public procurement of the key drug for treating HIV, with a focus on upper-middle income countries

- Intervened during the tenders, the DTG price in Belarus and Kazakhstan fell from \$USD 100 to \$USD 50 in 2021
- The price for DTG in Russia has also dropped by more than a half since 2019
 - the number of people on DTG has increased from 30,000 to 140,000, but there is still a long way to go!
